INTRODUCTION:

The following statements outline the dress code that is expected of everyone attending a New Hampshire authorized BLS Psychomotor Examination.

The practical examination is a hands-on skills testing process for a medical profession therefore attire (including footwear) at these exams is expected to be clean, neat, and professional. This applies to anyone involved with the process including candidates, evaluators, assistants, patients, site coordinators and instructors.

- Examination participants must not wear any sort of uniform or insignia which identifies their EMS affiliations or level of training. All candidates should be dressed in plain clothes with appropriate closed-toed shoes.
- Participants attending the examination with attire and/or footwear deemed inappropriate by the Examination Coordinator will be asked to leave the examination if the issue cannot be resolved.
- Any participant asked to leave the examination because of inappropriate attire and/or footwear will be allowed to register for another practical exam at another date/site. Removal for this reason shall not be considered a failed attempt of the practical examination.

A NH EMS Incident Report form shall be filed by Examination Staff Personnel should a candidate be removed from the exam for any reason.

Appeals are in accordance with Saf-C 200.
