State Fire Instructor Initial Application Guide

Purpose


This guide will outline the process to apply for your State Fire Instructor Credential in RespondNH.

To apply for State Fire Instructor you must hold a ProBoard Firefighter I, or higher certification and a Fire and Emergency Services Instructor I, or higher certification. If your certifications do not appear in your "Certifications" tab under your account in RespondNH, please email them to fstems@dos.nh.gov before you begin this process.

Application Procedure

- Navigate to https://www.respondnh.org We recommend using Google Chrome web browser.
- Login using your credentials.
 - a. See <u>Claiming Your Account</u> if you have never logged in before.
- Select "Applications" from the left-hand menu:



Next Steps

Once the Division has reviewed your application, we will contact you with details about the next steps. These may include:

- Train-the-Trainer and Orientation Session:
 This session covers the current curriculum, available resources, and the guidelines for your State Fire Instructor credential.
- Mentored Teaching:
 The Fire Standards Training Commission (FSTC) requires a recommendation from at least one approved mentor for State Fire Instructor status. Typically, this involves completing approximately 20 hours of mentored teaching. Details about this process will be explained during your Orientation session.
